

What you need to know about the vaccination



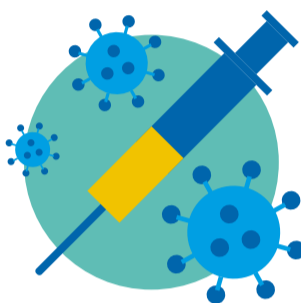
1. Vaccination can reduce your risk of being seriously ill or dying from Covid-19.



5. The Covid-19 vaccine is being offered to everyone aged 18 or over. The vaccination is free.



2. Once you've been vaccinated, your body's immune system builds up defences against Covid-19.



6. You can still get the vaccine, even if you're an asylum-seeker or are in Sweden without a permit.



3. If you don't fall ill, the risk of infecting others is reduced.



7. You can still get the vaccine, even if you don't have an ID document, a Swedish national insurance number, or a coordination number. You'll be given a temporary number by the health care sector.



4. Getting vaccinated reduces the spread of infection in society.



8. People at risk of becoming seriously ill will be offered the vaccine first.
